Application Requirements:

- An intermediate level of English proficiency is recommended to ensure a full engagement in learning and collaboration. Support will be available to help students adapt.
- A strong willingness to interact and communicate is required in discussions, teamwork, and networking opportunities to maximize learning experience.

Program Fee includes:

- All the lectures, workshops, lab activities, on-campus visits and academic exchanges.
- Lodging at the University Village (Summer 2025), or a nearby hotel (Winter 2026) throughout the entire program (double occupancy).
- Transportation for airport pickup and drop-off.
- Transportation for excursions specified in the program schedule.
- Some of the meals specified in the program schedule.
- Invitation letter, program certificate and individual transcript.
