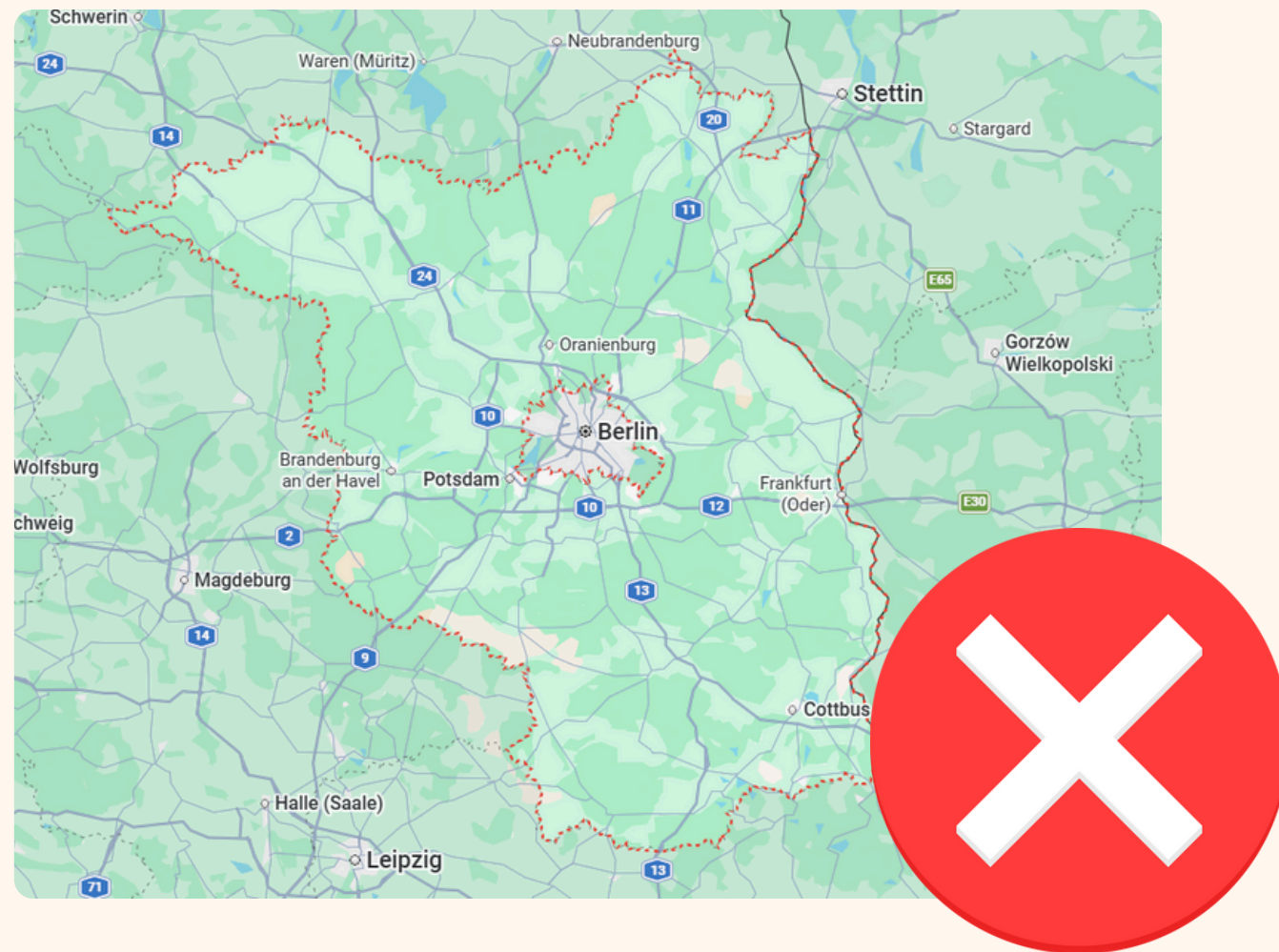

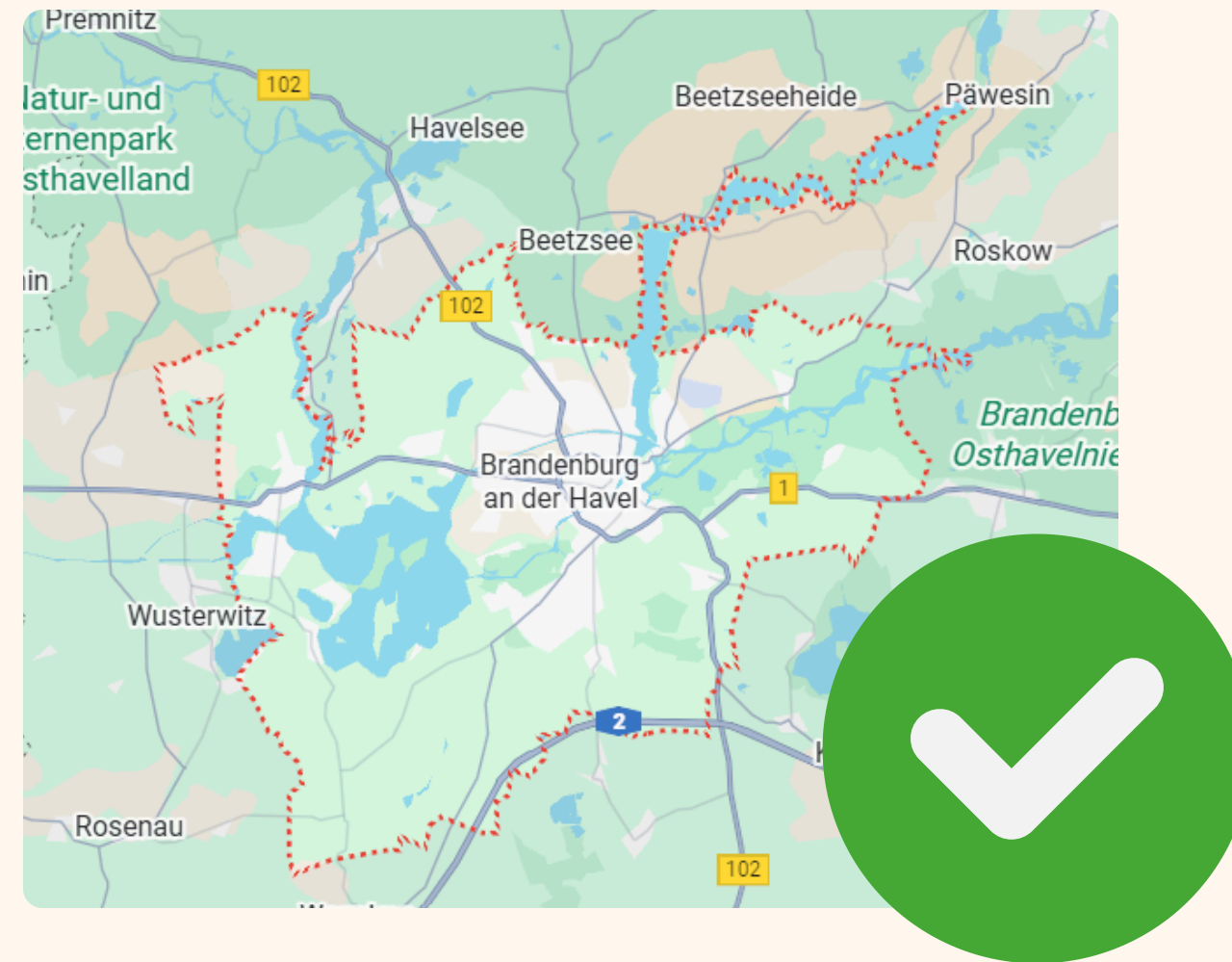

Brandenburg (state)

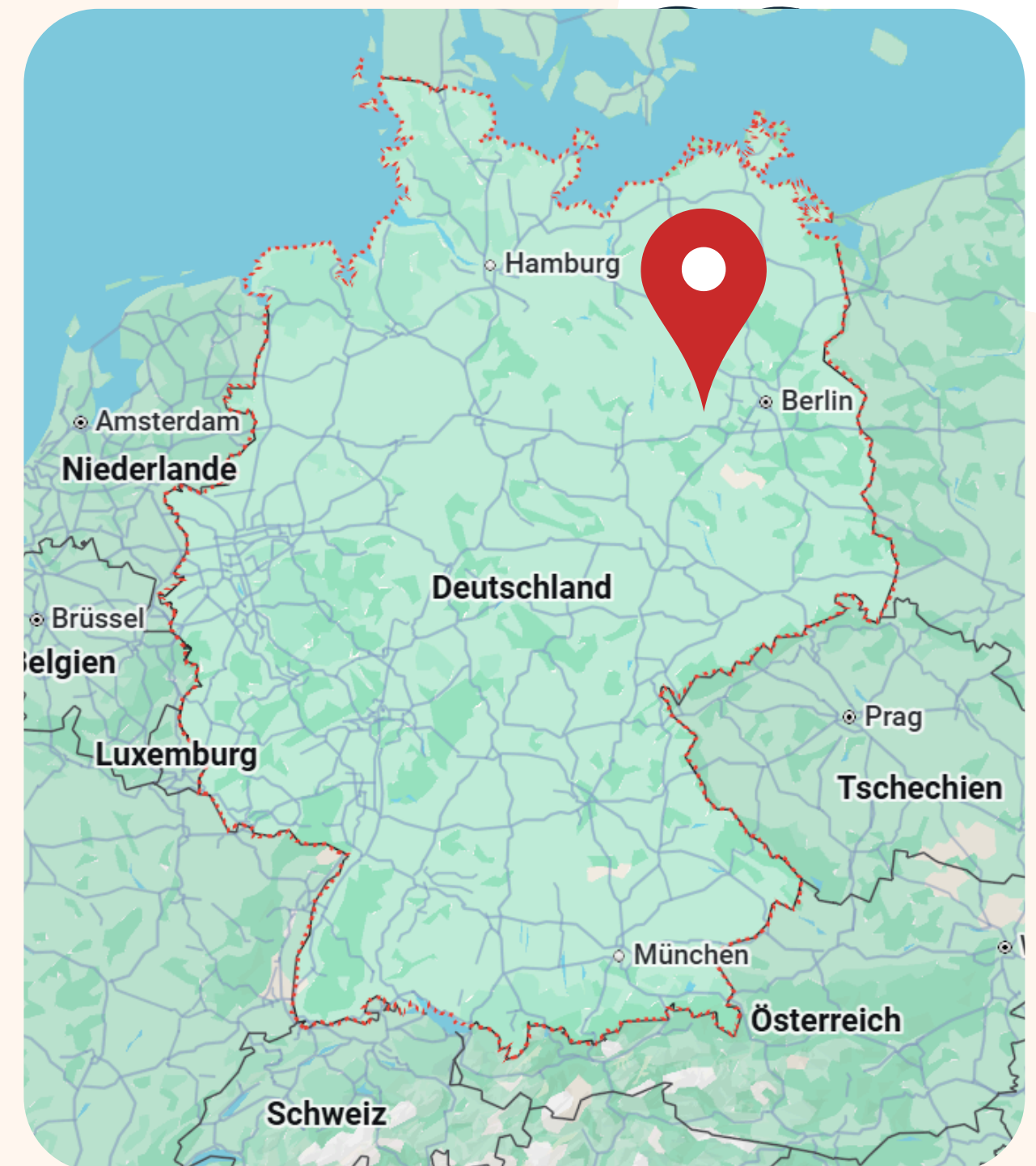


Brandenburg an der Havel (city)



WHERE IS BRANDENBURG?

- city in eastern Germany
- 1 hour west of Berlin by train
- Population: ~72,000
- Very green, surrounded by rivers and lakes



THE UNIVERSITY

- small but nice
- around 3000 students
- focus on a few majors
- many partnerships with universities around the world
- focus on practice rather than theory



LIBRARY / MENSA

- again small but nice
- nice place to study and to do group work
- Mensa = restaurant of the university
- affordable food (at least for Germany)

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WHAT TO EXPECT

- Calm, student-friendly city
- Much cheaper than Berlin (rent, groceries, cafés)
- Nature everywhere: biking, swimming, kayaking in summer
- Everything is reachable by bike





WINTER TIME

- December - February: Temperatures are between -2 to 7, sometimes there is snow, it's often cloudy and the days are short.





SPRING

March - May: Temperatures are between 10–20 °C, the weather is mild, sometimes rainy and nature slowly turns green.





SUMMER TIME

June - August: Temperatures are between 20–30 °C, days are warm to hot, there are occasional thunderstorms and the sun sets very late (9:36 PM).





AUTUMN

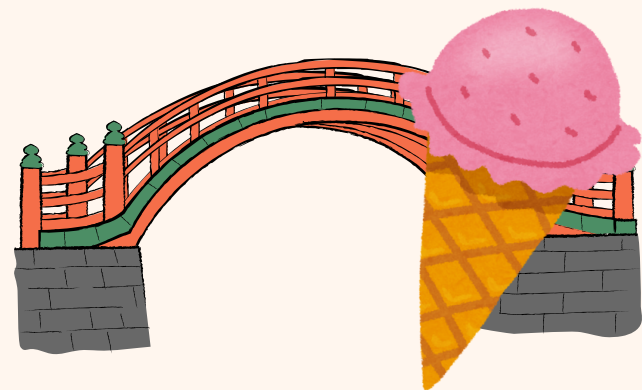
- September - November: Temperatures are between 10–18°C, it is cooler, windier, and rainier. Nature is full of colorful leaves.

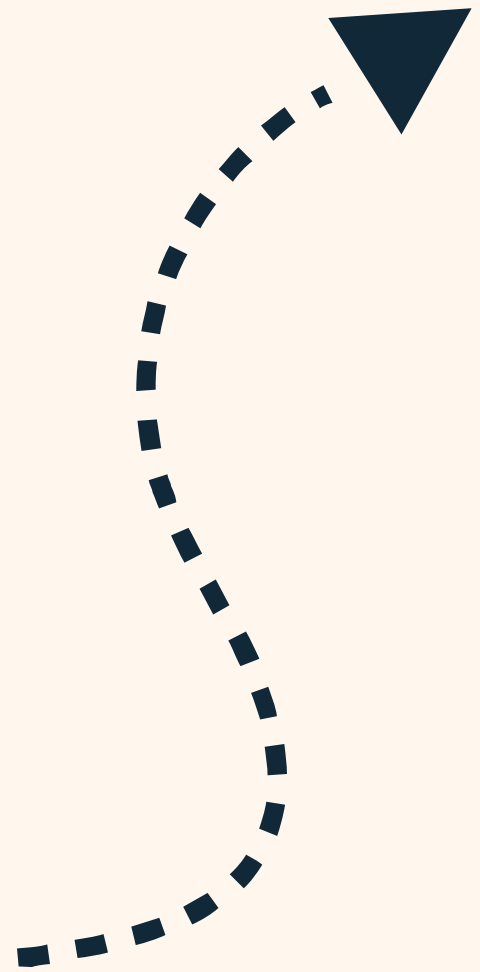
RECOMMENDED APPS

- Transportation: Omio, FlixBus, DB Navigator, Ryanair, Turkish Airlines
- ISIC: International Student Identity Card (useful for discounts around the world)
- Health insurance: Techniker Krankenkasse (TK) (included in Expatrio value package)
- Bank account: Revolut, Expatrio



MORE TIPS!!!

- Get a short-term eSim for a few days (e. g. Saily, Holafly), so you are already connected on arrival, afterwards get a local SIM card. You can use the local SIM card anywhere in the EU.
- Local SIM options: Congstar, Vodafone, Fraenk, Aldi Talk
- Enable the 'online foreign remittance' function of your Taiwanese bank account to transfer funds more easily to your German bank account.
- get a travel adapter, because Germany uses different plugs and the voltage is higher
- bring Chinese seasoning with you (hard to find and expensive in Germany)
- recommended Facebook groups: 台灣人在德國, 台灣歐洲交換學生
- digitize important documents!

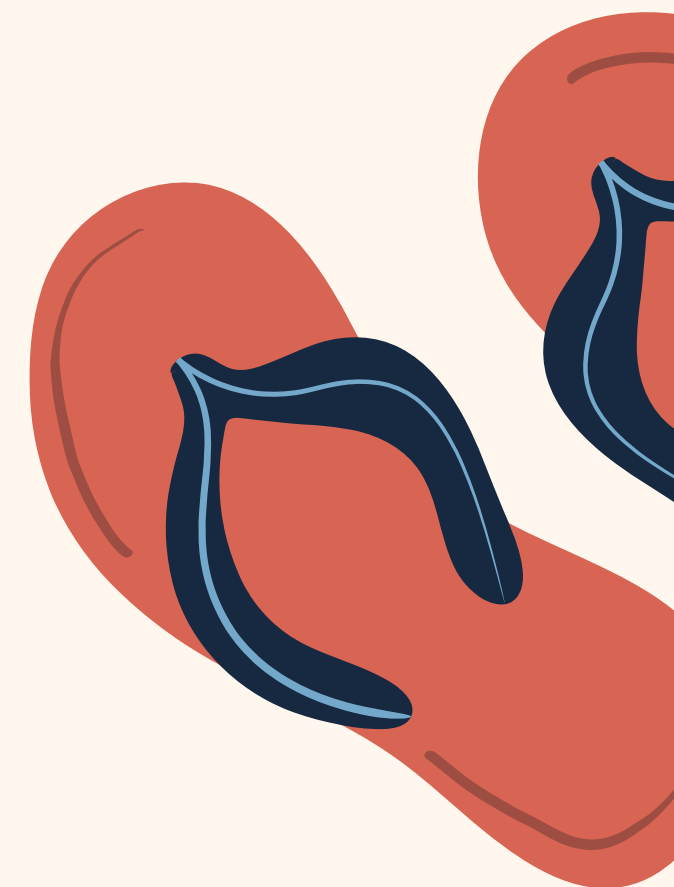
