INTRODUCTION

An immersive program that brings together 20 international participants to explore the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and experience the vibrant beauty of Indonesia through the dynamic lens of Semarang City. Co-hosted by two leading universities — Universitas Islam Sultan Agung (UNISSULA) and Universitas Semarang (USM) — this program offers a unique blend of education, community engagement, and cultural exploration.

At UNISSULA, participants will have the chance to contribute to local community development, focusing on general health and the well-being of residents. Engage in meaningful activities while gaining insights into Indonesia's education system through seminars and school visits.

USM will lead the participants to explore innovative, sustainable energy and economic development solutions. Participants will visit iconic landmarks and local projects highlighting renewable energy installations and green business practices. Through community engagement, students will collaborate with locals to understand energy access and economic growth challenges, contributing creative solutions to empower communities.

Additionally, cultural immersion activities such as traditional crafts and culinary experiences will deepen participants' appreciation of Indonesia's heritage. Combining education, expert training, cultural exchange, and hands-on experiences, **"THE SUMMER SPACE"** equips students with the knowledge and inspiration to become ambassadors for SDG 3 (*Good Health and Well-Being*), SDG 4 (*Quality Education*), SDG 7 (*Affordable and Clean Energy*), and SDG 8 (*Decent Work and Economic Growth*) fostering a sustainable future for Semarang, Indonesia, and beyond.

HOST INSTITUTIONS

1. Universitas Islam Sultan Agung (UNISSULA)



Universitas Islam Sultan Agung (UNISSULA) is an Islamic private university located in the vibrant city of Semarang, the heart of Central Java province, Indonesia. It was established in May 20th, 1962 by Sultan Agung Waqf Foundation. UNISSULA was named after Sultan Agung, a national hero of Indonesia who ruled Mataram Sultanate from 1613 to 1645. With long tradition of providing excellent quality, UNISSULA contributes in the field of Education, Research, and Community Service in the national as well as international level.

UNISSULA currently offers 23 undergraduate programs, 11 master programs, and 4 doctoral programs in the field of Humanities, Education, Engineering, and Health. At the institutional level, UNISSULA already achieved the highest accreditation status as “UNGGUL/EXCELLENT” by the National Accreditation Board of Indonesian Higher Education. Most of its departments has also accredited internationally by ASICS (London) and ABEST 21 (Japan).

2. Universitas Semarang (USM)



Universitas Semarang was established on June 23, 1987, originally as a polytechnic (Politeknik Semarang) offering four associate degree (D-III) programs: Legal Administration, Business Management, Hydraulic Civil Engineering, and Agricultural Product Technology. In 1994, Politeknik Semarang officially transitioned into a university and was renamed Universitas Semarang (USM).

Currently, USM offers 16 study programs, including Associate Degree (D-III) in Business Management, Bachelor's Degree (S-1) in Law, Management, Accounting, Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Urban and Regional Planning, Agricultural Product Technology, Psychology, Information Systems, Informatics Engineering, Communication Studies, and Tourism. USM also offer Master's Degree (S-2) in Management, Law, and Psychology.

ARIVAL AND DEPARTURE

Participants are advised to arrive in Soekarno Hatta International Airport, Jakarta as the entry point to Indonesia. From Jakarta, participants may take two (2) options to go to Semarang city:

1. Domestic Flight from *Soekarno Hatta International Airport* (CGK) Jakarta to *Jenderal Ahmad Yani Airport* (SRG) Semarang city. The flight takes approximately 1 hour. Please allocate at least 5 hours between your international arrival and the domestic flight in case you have to move to other Terminal.
2. Intercity Train from *Gambir Station* Jakarta to *Tawang Bank Jateng Station* Semarang city. The trip takes approximately 5 to 6 hours. You may take traditional / online transportation from the airport to the train station.

Please arrive in Semarang city on 4 August 2025. You should not worry about your access to the lodging, because we provide all accommodation including pick up service at airport/train station. Please make sure to confirm your arrival details to us.

FACILITIES AND BENEFIT

All students from UMAP members (except Indonesian nationality) could register in this program through USCO in UMAP website and nomination from the home university is mandatory. The program fee is waived for all selected students. However, you need to be responsible with your return flight ticket, visa fees (if any), travel insurance and other personal expenses.

During the program, all participants will stay in Accommodation prepared by the hosts. The committee also provide pick up arrangement on August 5 and drop off service on August 16 in Semarang. The participants who complete the program are entitled to receive certificate of participation from UNISSULA and USM.

CURRENCY INFORMATION

During this program, you should also bring extra money. Indonesia mainly accept Indonesian Rupiah (IDR) as payment. Should you have to exchange money after your arrival, you may also need to bring money in US Dollar (USD). In Surabaya and Semarang, many big shops accept visa and master card for payment.

CLIMATE AND WEATHER

Indonesia is a tropical country with 2 seasons only; Rainy Season and Dry Season. The humidity level is high, especially during April to November. We suggest you to bring umbrella or a raincoat along. Semarang city is also known for its hot temperature up to 36° Celcius. When it rains, the temperature drops into around 23° – 25° Celcius.

DRESSCODE

Appropriate clothing during the program consists of common appropriate working outfit including collar shirt, blouse over full-length jeans and trousers and a pair of shoes. **Please wear collared outfit in formal session during this program** to comply the regulation in our universities.

During rainy season, a jumper/sweater/pullover or sweatshirt will be sufficient. You may not need to bring too many personal items for your necessities in Indonesia. UNISSULA and USM are located near malls and shopping centres that provide daily needs, clothing and electronics equipment.
