



**4+1 BRIDGE DEGREE PROGRAM AGREEMENT**

**BETWEEN**

**THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT DALLAS, U.S.A**

**AND**

**NATIONAL YUNLIN UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY – YUNTECH,  
TAIWAN**

This 4+1 Bridge Degree Program Agreement is between Naveen Jindal School of Management at the University of Texas at Dallas, U.S.A and the College of Management at National Yunlin University of Science and Technology – Yuntech, Taiwan.

**RECITALS**

WHEREAS, The University of Texas at Dallas (UT Dallas), located at 800 W. Campbell Road, Richardson, Texas, 75080, U.S.A., through its legal representative, Dr. Inga H. Musselman, Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost, hereby represents that

UT Dallas is a duly incorporated UNIVERSITY pursuant to the laws of the State of Texas, as evidenced in Chapter 70, Texas Education Code.

Its legal representative, Dr. Inga H. Musselman, Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost, has all the necessary and sufficient powers to execute this Degree Program Agreement, on behalf of UT Dallas, as evidenced in the Texas Education Code Sections 65.31(g) and 65.34, and The University of Texas System Board of Regents Rules and Regulations, Rule 10501.

WHEREAS, National Yunlin University of Science and Technology (YunTech), with registered offices in 123 University Road, Section 3, Douliou, Yunlin 64002, Taiwan, R.O.C., represented by Shyh-Huei Hwang, Vice President, has all the necessary and sufficient powers to execute this Degree Program Agreement, on behalf of Yuntech, as evidenced by Article 8 of the University Act and Articles 3 and 4 of the National Yunlin University of Science and Technology Organizational Regulations.

WHEREAS, Cordial relations exist between UT Dallas and YunTech;

All international partnership proposals are subject to the review and approval of the International Education Development Committee (IEDC).



WHEREAS, UT Dallas and YunTech desire to establish certain exchange programs beneficial to the respective educational institutions and to promote the development of studies, research and training activities, and other educational programs of mutual interest; and

WHEREAS, UT Dallas and YunTech believe that international understanding and educational opportunities of their students and faculty would be enhanced by international academic and scholarly cooperation.

NOW THEREFORE YunTech, on behalf of their College of Management (COM), and UT Dallas, on behalf of the Naveen Jindal School of Management (JSOM), enter into a Degree Program Agreement.

#### TERMS

In contemplation of the relationship to be established and for valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

#### 1.0 Purpose of the Degree Program Agreement and Definitions.

1.1 The purpose of this Agreement is to set out the terms and conditions under which UT Dallas JSOM and National Yunlin University of Science and Technology (YunTech) shall conduct an accelerated 4+1 program to award the UT Dallas JSOM Master of Science in MS in Business Analytics and the MS in International Management Studies. The UT Dallas JSOM 4+1 Program will be developed through mutual cooperation between UT Dallas JSOM and National Yunlin University of Science and Technology (YunTech).

The primary objective of this 4+1 Bridge Program Agreement is to articulate the transfer of graduate credits from YunTech to UT Dallas JSOM based on the Articulation of Credits in Appendix A and the guidelines of the current UT Dallas Undergraduate and Graduate Catalogs. The 4+1 Bridge Degree Program Agreement requires 1) the satisfaction of admission and graduation requirements at UT Dallas and 2) the transfer of credits from YunTech to the UT Dallas JSOM degree programs mentioned above. The agreement must include a clear sequence of courses from YunTech to UT Dallas, including course numbering system, grading system, and equivalency of courses between YunTech and UT Dallas.

1.2 "Agreement" refers to this Agreement that is executed between the parties.

1.3 "Home Institution" is a party to this Agreement that sends students to the other party (institution) to pursue a degree program (YunTech).

1.4 "Host Institution" is a party to this Agreement that accepts the student(s) from the other party (institution) to pursue a degree program (UT Dallas).

All international partnership proposals are subject to the review and approval of the International Education Development Committee (IEDC).



2.0 Term and Renewal. This Agreement shall take effect on the date of its execution and shall continue in effect for an initial period of five (5) years unless terminated earlier by either institution. Such termination by one institution shall be effected by giving the other institution at least six (6) months advance written notice of its intention to terminate. If such notice is given, this Agreement shall terminate: (a) at the end of such six (6) months; or (b) when all students enrolled in a course of study pursuant to a Program Agreement at the time such notice is given have completed their respective courses of study, whichever event occurs last.

3.0 Admission and Graduation:

3.1 YunTech shall select prospective students based on their academic excellence, English proficiency, suitability of the program for the student, and serious intent of studying at UT Dallas JSOM among those satisfying a minimum requirement on GPA, TOEFL, and other admission requirements set by UT Dallas, and provide UT Dallas JSOM with a list of recommended students for admission to UT Dallas at least 3 months before the UT Dallas application and documents deadline for fall and spring semester: February 1 for fall semester; June 1 for spring semester.

3.2 Students accepted and enrolled in the YunTech Bridge Program (collectively, "students," and, each, a "student") are eligible to apply for the UT Dallas JSOM 4+1 Program. All students who apply for the UT Dallas JSOM 4+1 Program must also follow the regular application procedures of UT Dallas JSOM in addition to those of YunTech and obtain acceptance to each program. YunTech student applicants to the UT Dallas JSOM 4+1 Program will be considered for admission to UT Dallas JSOM on an equal basis with all other applicants provided that they meet the prerequisites and requirements for admission to UT Dallas JSOM. UT Dallas JSOM reserves the right of final approval on the admission of any student applicant to the UT Dallas JSOM 4+1 Program.

3.3 To be granted any of the above-mentioned degrees in article 1 from UT Dallas JSOM, students shall be required to meet the graduation requirements of UT Dallas JSOM and the Articulation Guide (a current version of which is attached hereto as Appendix A) then in effect at the time of the student's admission. The Articulation Guide for UT Dallas JSOM is subject to periodic change at the sole and absolute discretion of UT Dallas. Thus, the Articulation Guide (Appendix A to this Agreement) may be altered, amended or changed by UT Dallas without written amendment of this Agreement. UT Dallas JSOM will promptly and reasonably notify YunTech of any changes of UT Dallas JSOM master's degree program curriculum and/or the Articulation Guide.

3.4 The combined period of study for the 4+1 Program at YunTech and UT Dallas JSOM does not have to be continuous. Undergraduate students in their senior year enrolled at YunTech will complete up to four master-level courses specified (master or graduate-level courses as confirmed on an official transcript from YunTech) in the Articulation Guide at YunTech, and will apply for admission to the desired MS program at UT Dallas JSOM after they have completed the related master-level courses at YunTech.

All international partnership proposals are subject to the review and approval of the International Education Development Committee (IEDC).



3.5 UT Dallas will admit those students as international transfer students when their credentials meet the UT Dallas admission requirements. UT Dallas reserves the right on final admission decision. In case of rejection, however, UT Dallas shall confer the matter with YunTech. Yuntech students will be subject to admission and graduation requirements according to the current UT Dallas *Undergraduate / Graduate Catalogs*. Students who do not meet UT Dallas JSOM's admission requirements, including TOEFL and GPA, will be eligible to apply again for admission once they meet the admission requirements. UT Dallas JSOM will promptly and reasonably notify YunTech of any changes to the admission requirements. English proficiency and other admission requirements for international students is available at <https://graduate-admissions.utdallas.edu/international-students/english-proficiency/>. 3.6 YunTech shall not award any master's degree in article 1 to students enrolled in the Bridge Program.

4.0 Curriculum and Credits: UT Dallas will evaluate the student's record to determine which credits earned at YunTech will transfer to UT Dallas. The list of equivalent courses offered by YunTech is to be detailed and maintained periodically. The transfer of credits will be subject to the current UT Dallas *Undergraduate / Graduate Catalogs*.

#### 4.1 Curricula

4.1.1. Semesters, sessions, and terms. [Definition of academic year, weeks per semester, etc.]

UT Dallas academic year consists of consecutive fall, spring, and summer semesters. Long semesters (fall and spring) are normally sixteen – weeks long. In addition, two eight –week sessions are offered during the long semester. The summer semester is eleven-weeks long. In addition, an eight –week and two five-week sessions are offered during the summer semester. The same academic credit is given for a course whether it is taken in the long semester sessions or the summer semester sessions.

Yuntech's academic year consists of consecutive fall and spring semesters. The fall and spring semesters are eighteen weeks long.

4.1.2. Course numbering system and academic credit.

UT Dallas course numbers are four digits. The first digit indicates the level of the course: 0 or D = remedial/non-credit, 1 = freshman, 2 = sophomore, 3 = junior, 4 = senior, 5-9 =

graduate courses. The second digit indicates the number of semester credit hours granted for the course.

Yuntech curriculum course numbers are six to eight digits long. The English letters indicate the program of the course: BA = Business Administration, IPM = International Management Program. The first digit, following the English letter, indicates the level of the course: 1 = freshman, 2 = sophomore, 3 = junior, 4 = senior, and 5–9 = graduate courses.

#### 4.1.3. Grading system.

UT Dallas and YunTech will mutually agree upon a satisfactory conversion system for grades.

According to Article 61 of the National Yunlin University of Science and Technology Academic Regulations, the percentage grading system uses 100 as the maximum score, with 70 as the passing grade. The grading scale and corresponding point values are as follows:

80 or above is graded as A, with 4 points. 70 to 79 is graded as B, with 3 points. 60 to 69 is graded as C, with 2 points. 50 to 59 is graded as D, with 1 point. Below 49 is graded as E, with 0 points.

4.1.4. Equivalency of courses: Incoming students will be subject to the degree curriculum in force for the semester of their admission (see <https://catalog.utdallas.edu>), which includes the courses and established equivalency. Students can transfer the credits from YunTech to UT Dallas JSOM according to the list of mutually agreed comparable courses will be maintained and periodically updated by designated sponsors of this program (attached as appendix A).



4.1.5. Online – only distance learning: Students may use a maximum of 9 semester credit hours of online-only distance learning [major] courses toward their degree. [Partner Institution] students will be able to take a maximum of 3 semester credit hours on online-only distance per long semester (Fall or Spring) at UT Dallas. YunTech students with J1 visas will not be able to take online-only distance courses.

5.0 Accreditation: UT Dallas is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) Commission on Colleges to award doctoral, master's, and baccalaureate degrees. YunTech is not accredited by the SACS Commission on Colleges and the accreditation of UT Dallas does not extend to or include YunTech or its students. Further, although UT Dallas agrees to accept certain course work from YunTech to be applied toward an award from UT Dallas, that course work may not be accepted by other colleges or universities in transfer, even if it appears on a transcript from UT Dallas. The decision to accept course work in transfer from any institution is made by the institution considering the acceptance of credits or course work.

6.0 Intellectual Property and Research Protocol. The Parties agree that Students hosted at UTD-JSOM shall be responsible for complying with UTD's policies and regulations as well as the intellectual property, privacy, and export laws and regulations of the United States of America and the Commonwealth of Texas.

6.1 All publications resulting from the collaboration between the two institutions under Agreements must give recognition to the Agreements therein. Likewise, the Agreements must also be mentioned in all courses and formal presentations that result from collaboration under the terms hereof. The parties shall include the following attribution in any such publication or presentation: "This work was supported primarily by the Degree Program Agreement between The University of Texas at Dallas and National Yunlin University of Science and Technology. Any opinions, findings and conclusions or recommendations expressed in this material are those of the author(s) and do not necessarily reflect those of The University of Texas at Dallas and National Yunlin University of Science and Technology."

6.2 Parties agree to the exchange of publications, such as books, academic journals, and other official publications, and research information generated by either of the parties in connection with this Agreement.

6.3 Should any faculty collaboration result in any potential for intellectual property, the parties shall immediately meet through designated representatives and seek an equitable and fair understanding as to ownership and other property interests that may arise. Any such discussions shall at all times strive to preserve a harmonious and continuing relationship between the parties.

7.0 Student Expenses. All travel, living, and miscellaneous expenses incurred in attending Host Institution, including tuition, fees, health insurance, meals, transportation, and lodging, shall be the responsibility of the student.

All international partnership proposals are subject to the review and approval of the International Education Development Committee (IEDC).



7.1 Each participating Student in this 4+1 program will be eligible for a scholarship when studying at UTD-JSOM. Students must apply by the deadlines and meet eligibility requirements for available scholarships accordingly.

8.0 Insurance. Health, medical evacuation and repatriation insurances are mandatory. Students must consult with the host institution's international student services office in advance for requirement satisfaction and adequate coverage at the host institution.

9.0 Academic and Disciplinary Rules.

9.1 For enrollment, grade evaluations, scholarships, student services, Student Conduct Code, advising, and other related matters, the students accepted into the UTD-JSOM 4+1 Program are required to observe all applicable UTD regulations including those of UTD-JSOM.

9.2 The parties agree that students will enjoy the same rights and privileges enjoyed by other students and faculty of the Host Institution.

9.3 The parties agree that each institution's policies and rules covering matters of academic responsibility and standards of conduct will be applicable to students while attending the Host Institution.

9.4 If Host Institution determines after investigation that a student violated such a policy or rule while attending Host Institution, Host Institution may terminate the student member's participation in the program.

9.5 If Home Institution determines that a student violated its policies or rules while attending Host Institution, Host Institution shall cooperate and provide Home Institution with information relating to the student's conduct while attending the Host Institution.

10.0 Orientation

10.1 The host institution must provide pertinent pre-arrival information to students including information regarding travel and entry, costs likely to be incurred, and any other information which will assist students to prepare for their stay at the host institution. Upon the arrival of Home students, Host Institution shall arrange and conduct a comprehensive on-site orientation program. This program shall include but is not limited to information concerning the Host Institution's policies on academic responsibilities and standards of conduct, immigration rules that the students are required to follow while at the Host Institution, and any known, abnormally dangerous conditions on the premises or in the city or country.

10.2 Visas and Immigration - Students are exclusively responsible for complying with all visa/immigration requirements, laws, and regulations of the host country, including obtaining and

maintaining the appropriate visa and/or permits needed for participation in their UTD-JSOM 4+1 Program at UTD-JSOM. Students will be issued UTD related immigration documentation following successful admission to the UTD-JSOM 4+1 Program. Neither UTD nor UTD-JSOM shall bear responsibility for those Students who fail to obtain and maintain necessary visas and/or permits or who fail to comply with the visa/immigration requirements, laws, and regulations of the host country. Each Student must keep UTD informed of any changes in their visa status. Students are exclusively responsible for payment of any fees or amounts required to maintain valid legal status in the host country including, but not limited to, required visa applications, permits, and/or associated immigration fees.

10.3 Host Institution will assist Home Institution and students to locate housing and provide other assistance to the visiting students and faculty.

11.0 Designated Sponsor. Each party designates the following officials to serve as its primary contact and liaison to arrange the initial resources needed to facilitate the partnership; review, evaluate, report program activities, and address any concerns or disputes that may arise relating to the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

12.0 Non-Discrimination. The Parties agree to preserve non-discriminatory behaviors. Also the parties agree to comply with all national, state, and local rules, regulations, executive orders, laws, and policies forbidding unlawful discrimination to which institution is subject.

All international partnership proposals are subject to the review and approval of the International Education Development Committee (IEDC).



13.0 Relationship of the Parties. The Agreement shall not be construed to create a relationship of partners, brokers, employees, servants, or agents as between the parties. The parties to the Agreement are acting as independent contractors.

14.0 Financial Obligations. Limitation of Resources Committed. Neither Party shall assume any financial obligations under this Agreement except as specifically provided for pursuant to this Agreement. This agreement does not create an obligation for either Party to provide resources necessary to carry out any part of this Agreement except as separately approved by the Party responsible for providing those resources.

15.0 Use of Institutions' Name; Advertising and Publicity. Neither party shall use the other institution's name, or any name that is likely to suggest that it is related to the other institution, in any advertising, promotional or sales literature without first obtaining the written consent of the other institution.

Prior written consent will not be required for use of the other Party's name in the context of factual or descriptive statements regarding the general purposes of this Agreement.

16.0 Governing Law; Forum.

16.1 All activities conducted under the Agreement must be conducted in accordance with the laws, rules, and regulations applicable to each institution. In the case of UT Dallas, these are the rules and guidelines of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges as well as the laws and regulations of the State of Texas and the United States of America. In the case of National Yunlin University of Science and Technology, these are the laws, rules, and regulations of Taiwan.

16.2 Personally identifiable information from students' education records shall be disclosed only in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). YunTech and its officers, employees and agents may use information from education records only for the purposes for which the disclosure was made. YunTech shall not disclose information from education records to any other party without first having received written consent of the student and having obtained assurances that the other party will fully comply with the provisions of FERPA and that no further disclosure by such party shall be permitted.

Failure to comply with the provisions of FERPA will result in the cancellation of this agreement and the eligibility for YunTech to receive any student information from UT Dallas for a period of not less than five (5) years. In addition, YunTech agrees to indemnify and hold UT Dallas harmless for any loss, cost, or expense suffered by UT Dallas as a direct result of YunTech's failure to comply with the requirement not to release information, except for the sole purpose stated above. YunTech agrees to either destroy the student

information in a manner that completely protects the confidentiality of the student information or return the information to UT Dallas upon the expiration of this Agreement.

17.0 Waiver. A waiver of any breach of any provision of the Agreement shall not be construed as a continuing waiver of said breach or a waiver of any other breaches of the same or other provisions of the Agreement.

18.0 Termination.

18.1 If either party breaches the terms and conditions of the Agreement, then the other party has the right to terminate the Agreements immediately upon written notice to the other. Before issuing written notice of termination, the parties must attempt to resolve any dispute in accordance with paragraph 20.

18.2 Either party has the right, upon proper notice, to terminate its obligations under the Agreement for reasons of force majeure. "Force majeure" are circumstances beyond the control of an institution that effectively prevent the institution from performing its obligations under the Agreement.

19.0 Amendment of Agreement. No amendment to the Agreement shall be effective unless reduced to writing and executed by the authorized representatives of UT Dallas and YunTech.

20.0 Right of Inspection. Parties agree that each institution shall permit the other institution to inspect facilities and services utilized in connection with any activity conducted under the Agreement.

21.0 Resolution of Disputes. The Agreement is based on the common trust and good faith of the parties. In case of disputes, the parties, through the sponsors designated in clause 11 of this Agreement, shall make a good faith effort to obtain an amicable resolution.

21.1 If this Agreement is in multiple languages, in the event of any inconsistency, the English version prevails. The foreign partner institution is responsible for the accurate translation of the English version.
