FEES

AVAILABLE PROGRAMMES

International students are required to take a full-time study load for visa purposes as follows:

One Semester students: 60 credits required (3-4 classes per semester)

Two Semester students: 120 credits required (6-8 classes for the academic year)

We recommend that students take classes from within one School. Module options will be advised at application stage.

TRANSCRIPTS

All credit-bearing Study Abroad students will be issued with a transcript detailing their modules and final grades at the end of the academic year. All non-credit bearing students will receive a Certificate of Attendance at the end of the academic year. This will be mailed directly to the home university.

VISA AND IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS

If you are coming to the UK as a student you may need to obtain entry clearance (a visa) before travelling to the UK, such as a Short-term Study Visa or a Tier 4 (General) Student Visa, unless you are a European Economic Area (EEA) or Swiss National. Find out if you need a visa by visiting the gov.uk website.

ACCOMMODATION

University Halls of Residence

As soon as you have received a course offer from us, you can apply for University accommodation. Students are advised to apply as soon as possible after accepting an offer.

2018/19 key application dates

- Applications for the academic year 2019/20 open in March 2019.
- Closing date for international student accommodation applications is 31 August 2019 for September 2019 entry.

Things to consider:

- Accommodation is subject to availability and cannot be guaranteed.
- Some accommodation options are not based in the city centre and may involve a journey by public transport.

CURRENT ESTIMATED COST OF LIVING*

According to the UK's National Union of Students (NUS), the average annual cost of living in England (outside of London) for students is £12,056**. Most students will spend around £150 (~US\$180) per month on food and groceries, or £1,350 (~US\$1,660) per academic year.

Living costs will vary depending on lifestyle but it is generally cheaper to live in Birmingham than other UK cities, such as London or Edinburgh. Here is a breakdown of some general expenses for you to consider when preparing your finances:

University accommodation (51 weeks) Please check with the Accommodation Services Team whether certain items are included e.g. bedding, kitchen utensils, etc, and whether you would be required to pay a deposit as well as made an advance payment. Fees can be found at www.bcu.ac.uk/accommodation .	From £3,510 (one semester) to £6,426 (51 weeks - two semesters)
Bedroom in a shared house Please check with the landlord whether bills are included in the price.	From £90 to £150 (per week)
Private shared house deposit	One month's rent in advance
Kitchen utensils, plates and cutlery	£35
Course related costs: books/stationery/photocopying/binding	£450 (annually)
TV licence	£145.50 (annually)
Insurance for personal belongings (depending on the level of cover)	£15 to £117 (annually)
Laundry (using a laundrette)	£240 (annually)
Food and groceries	£2,600 (annually)
Mobile telephone (depends on usage)	£240 (annually)
Bus pass – 3 terms + summer pass	£390 (annually)
Meal in a restaurant for one person	£10 to £30
Cappuccino (regular)	£3
Police registration (if applicable)	£34
Subscription to journals/magazines	£36 (over 9 months)
Gas and electricity (if required)	£230 (per month)
Social activity costs (depending on activities)	£70 to £100 (per month)
