Student workload	The normal workload for full-time students is 30 ECTS credits per semester.

Application process	<p>Requested application documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learning agreement listing the course units that they wish to take* • Transcripts of Records obtained in previous years of study • Copy of passport <p>If a student intends to do a thesis project at HsKA or an internship in industry, a short description of the intended subject area of the thesis / the internship is required.</p> <p><u>Applications sent by post cannot be considered.</u></p> <p><u>Incomplete applications cannot be considered.</u></p> <p><u>It is very important that the applicants spell their full name as it appears on their passport, and that they attach a copy of their passport.</u></p> <p><u>Any delay in sending the documents may cause problems in finding accommodation.</u></p> <p>Students who need a visa should bear in mind that the visa application process may take up to ten weeks. We therefore strongly recommend that those students submit their application as early as possible, and <u>no later than May 15 / November 15.</u></p> <p>Once we have received the complete application we will forward it to the relevant faculty for their assessment. This may take up to 6 weeks. As soon as the faculty has agreed to accept a student we will issue the invitation letter. An electronic copy, which can be used for a visa application, will be sent to the student by e-mail. As the original will be sent by ordinary mail, please note that the delivery date is beyond our control.</p>	
Language requirement	<p>For courses taught in German, a minimum language competency at CEFR (<i>Common European Framework of Reference for Languages</i>) B level is required. Likewise, for the International Program a minimum English language competency at CEFR B level is required.</p> <p><u>Students who do not fulfill the language requirement cannot be accepted.</u></p>	
Can students extend their exchange period?	<p>Yes, but this would be subject to the approval of the home and host universities. Students may extend their stay for another study semester or for an internship in industry, provided they have been successful in finding a placement for themselves. HsKA will assist exchange students in finding a place, but cannot provide internships itself.</p>

Course schedule/timetable	Will be provided upon arrival.
Medium of instruction and assessment	The medium of instruction and assessment for courses offered within the HsKA International Program is English. For other courses it is German, unless specified otherwise.
Minimum and maximum number of credits to be taken per semester	Maximum number of ECTS credit points per semester: 30. Depending on approval by the sending institution, exchange students can take fewer credits, but not more.
Are students allowed to take cross-faculty modules?	Yes, subject to approval by the faculties involved. It is the student's responsibility to make sure that this does not result in timetable clashes.
Level of courses	Exchange students normally take courses according to their academic level at their home institution. Advanced bachelor students may be eligible to take master's courses, provided they meet the respective academic requirements.
Language classes	<p>German Language Intensive Course starting approx. two weeks before lectures start (levels A 1 – B2.2). German language classes are also offered during the semester (level A 1 – B 2.2). All German language classes are free of charge for exchange students. For higher levels, students will be assisted in finding courses at other institutions.</p> <p>Other language courses including English, French and Spanish are offered to interested students free of charge at the HsKA's Foreign Language Institute (IFS).</p>
Transcripts	HsKA's International Office will receive the official transcripts approx. 6 - 7 weeks after end of examination period and will send them on to the sending institutions International Office by e-mail and, if requested, also in paper form.

Accommodation	
Is university accommodation available for exchange students?	<p>There are 2 options:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students can apply for university accommodation directly at the Student Services. Information at www.sw-ka.de/en. 2. The International Office has a limited quota of rooms in student hostels. Students will receive information on how to apply for such a room with their invitation letter. These rooms can only be rented for one semester.
Is university accommodation guaranteed?	No.
Is accommodation available over semester breaks?	University accommodation (option 2) can only be rented for a complete semester.

Are exchange students allowed to work?	Exchange students are expected to have a full study workload. In order for students to get the most out of their exchange academically we cannot recommend working.

Is an airport pick-up service available?	No. The train connections between Frankfurt airport and Karlsruhe are excellent, with trains running hourly during the day time.	
Orientation period	Orientation and welcome week in winter semester 2020/21: September 7-11, 2020 Introductory meetings of faculties, student union and student organizations in the first week of lectures.	

Insurance	
Are exchange students required to purchase insurance?	<p>Yes. It is mandatory for registration. Very probably, starting in Winter Semester 2020_21, there will be new health insurance requirements!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Private travel health insurances will no longer be accepted. 2. Students will need a full coverage health insurance, including a nursing care insurance 3. We recommend to take out travel insurance after arrival. Information will be given in the International Office. The cost is approx. € 100 per month.

Estimated expenses in local currency
<p><i>(The estimated costs are for reference only. Actual expenses may vary from person to person.)</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • € 77,70 contribution fee for student services (Studierendenwerk) per semester • € 5 one-off fee for the campus card • Approx. € 300 for accommodation per month

- Approx. € 80 for health insurance per month
- Approx. € 160 per semester for public transport (depending on the student's place of residence)
- Approx. € 80 per month for meals in the student canteen

It is not possible to transfer payments in advance. Students must make sure they have sufficient financial means for meeting the costs above and living expenses once they are in Karlsruhe (details will be given by the International Office).

German Grading system

Karlsruhe University of Applied Sciences uses the following grading scheme:

- 1,0 – 1,5 (Very good)
- 1,6 – 2,5 (Good)
- 2,6 – 3,5 (Satisfactory)
- 3,6 – 4,0 (Sufficient)
- 4,1 – 5,0 (non-sufficient / fail)
